<p>Arrival & Dismissal Procedures For arrival, the school will be divided into 4 zones: car riders, walkers, van and bus riders.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <u>Car riders</u> will enter the front drop off zone where they will be greeted by a staff member. Students will be directed from their car to the school doors.• <u>Walkers</u> will arrive on campus and stand on designated points outside of the school. At 8:25, students will enter the building.• <u>Bus riders</u> will enter the parking lot. Each rider will receive a colored band and will be escorted to their classroom.• Van riders will enter the student drop off zone. Students will be directed from their car to the school doors. <p>For dismissal, the school will be divided into 4 zones: car riders, walkers, van and bus riders. <u>Car riders</u> will be escorted to the car zone. Each family will be assigned to an A or B side. Staff will help students locate their families and once students are safely loaded in their cars, families will be directed to leave the loop. <u>Walkers</u> will be escorted from the school to their designated location off the school campus for pickup. <u>Bus riders</u> will board the bus when it arrives. Students will have designated seats to ride the bus and will need to return to school with the colored bus band for the first 2-weeks of school.</p>	<p>Screening & Testing (<i>Safety is Our True North</i>)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• All families should screen students for symptoms prior to leaving home.• Please use this checklist to determine if a student should or should not go to school.• Persons with COVID-19 symptoms in school will be required to be tested or will be placed on quarantine, in alignment with guidance from the Maryland Department of Health.
<p>Face Covering (<i>Safety is Our True North</i>) Requirements: All persons, regardless of vaccination status, must wear a face covering while inside a school. Exceptions to this requirement are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The person is alone in a private space.• The person is eating or drinking.• The person has a documented physical or developmental disability that makes wearing a mask unsafe.• The person is under the age of two. <p>The person is a student athlete engaged in the sport in the field of play.</p>	<p>Social Distancing (<i>Safety is Our True North</i>) Requirements: Physical distancing of students from each other and between students and adults will be provided to the greatest extent possible, considering school enrollment and facility constraints. Strategies include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use of classroom and cafeteria configurations that provide maximal separation between students.• Plans for arrival, dismissal and change of classes to reduce gathering of students in any area.• Restriction of field trips to day trips only, with plans to reduce exposure to large crowds.• Plans for supervision of restrooms, locker rooms, and school lockers to prevent congregation of students.
<p>Hand Hygiene (<i>Safety is Our True North</i>) Requirements: Employees and students have been instructed to adhere to best practices in hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette. Times for handwashing or use of hand sanitizer to include before and after meals, upon arrival to schools' offices and home, before and after use of any shared items, after use of the restroom, after sneezing/coughing and other time hands are contaminated.</p>	<p>Breakfast & Lunch Breakfast and lunch are free of charge. Students will receive a breakfast each day upon entering the main doors and will eat breakfast in their classroom before the start of the school day. Lunch will be served in the cafeteria each day. Students will eat lunch on a rotation schedule.</p>



<p>Supplies & Devices: Students should bring their charged device with the charging cord daily. Students will need a set of headphones and a backpack. All supplies should be labeled with the students' name. These include but are not limited to pencils, crayons, whiteboard and marker, and paper.</p> 	<p>Visitors (<i>Safety is Our True North</i>)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To visit a BCPS school, visitors must have an appointment. • Visits will be conducted remotely or outside, whenever possible. • If an indoor visit is required, visitors will be required to wear a face coverings and practice social distancing. • The number of people admitted to the building will be limited.
<p>Athletics (Secondary)/Extra Curriculars Students will have opportunities to participate in extracurricular activities throughout the school year. As programs are planned and become available, notifications will be provided. Opportunities will be in-person and virtually.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This site contains current information for mitigation related to athletics in BCPS. 	<p>Cleaning/Disinfecting (<i>Safety is Our True North</i>) Requirements: BCPS staff will continue to provide safe and clean school environments by ensuring daily cleaning of buildings using Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) approved germicidal agents that kill coronavirus. BCPS staff will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Perform frequent cleaning and disinfection of high-contact surfaces and any shared items, at least daily. • Promote hand washing before and after touch of shared use items. • Maintain sufficient supplies of soap, paper towels, and hand sanitizer.
