English Language Arts

Entering 4 th Grade	Summarize text using main idea/key details Cite evidence explaining informational text Compare genres of informational text Determine directly/indirectly stated themes Determine connotations in information and literary texts Explain how an author supports an argument
Entering 5 th Grade	Explain how plot events create structure Cite evidence when explaining literary text and informational text Cite details to support ideas and text analysis Use context clues to define academic words Use word relationships to clarify word meanings Explain common idioms, adages, and other sayings
Entering 6 th Grade	Summarize text, citing specific evidence and supporting details Identifying and questioning an author's assumptions Determining the accuracy of statements Analyzing the author's word choices Making and justifying a claim Writing in response to text, including an introduction and thesis statement
